### COOLING-OFF PERIOD

Further, the net amount of payment or delivery due the TRUSTOR shall be based on the transaction day's NAVpu when notice of redemption, termination or cancellation was received.

### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund is a Peso-denominated equity Unit Investment Trust Fund that aims to achieve for its participants, market returns closely approximating the returns of the Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) by investing in the same issues comprising the PSEi and in approximately the same weights. The Fund may also be invested in short term fixed income securities for prudential liquidity requirements or are as interim or temporary investments. The Fund's benchmark is the Philippine Stock Exchange Index .

### CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process is performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are encouraged to update the resulting profile every three (3) years or if there's any change in his/her personal/financial circumstances. Before deciding to invest, clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, or seek an independent/professional opinion when necessary.

### The METRO PHILIPPINE EQUITY INDEX TRACKER FUND is suitable only for investors who:

- Have an Aggressive profile.
- Want capital growth over the long-term and are willing to be exposed to a higher level of risk that may involve possible loss of principal in the short-term in exchange for higher long-term gains.
- Recommended investment horizon is at least five (5) years
- Participation in the Fund shall be open to Filipino individuals, resident and non-resident aliens and corporate accounts.

### KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

**You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.**

<b>Market/Price Risk:</b>	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to changes in the market prices of stocks/equities. It refers to the portfolio's exposure to marked-to-market valuation due to market price fluctuations of the stocks/equities.
<b>Liquidity Risk:</b>	The possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the inability to sell or convert assets into cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a price that could result in a loss. This may be caused by low trading volume due to different reasons such as securities with small or few outstanding issues, absence of buyers and/or sellers (limited buy/sell activity) or underdeveloped capital market.

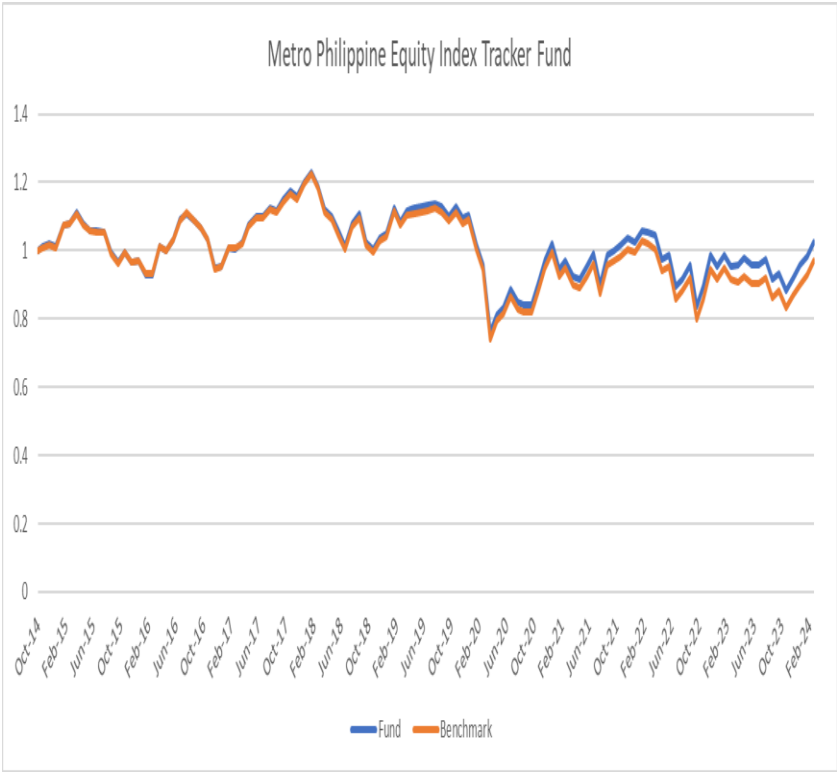

² Volatility measures the degree to which the Fund fluctuates vis-à-vis its average return over a period of time. Starting December 2017, computation is based on the annualized standard deviation of monthly returns.

³ Sharpe Ratio is used to characterize how well the return of a Fund compensates the investor for the level of risk taken. The higher the number, the better.

⁴ Information Ratio measures reward-to-risk efficiency of the portfolio relative to the benchmark. The higher the number, the higher the reward per unit of risk.

⁵ Tracking Error measures the deviation between the Fund's return and benchmark return since the Fund's inception. The lower the number, the more aligned the Fund's return is with the benchmark.

## OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Since bottoming out in October 2023, the PSEI has been on a steady uptrend, rallying +4.5% MoM to close at 6,944.71 in February, pushing the index up +7.7% YTD. This upward movement was fueled by improving macroeconomic indicators domestically, stable corporate earnings releases, and robust foreign inflows. Notably, the banking (+8.6% MoM) and industrials (+8.6%) sectors led the gains, while properties (-2.7%) and mining (-8.0%) ended in the red. ICT emerged as the top index gainer primarily due to foreign inflows and anticipation of strong core earnings results. Average volume turnover for the month stayed tepid at P5.2bn as investors lacked conviction beyond 7,000. On the flipside, foreigners were consistently buyers in the local equities market by USD129mn, extending their buying streak to 4 months.

In terms of corporate earnings, most of the nine PCOMP index constituents that reported 2023 full-year earnings fell within market expectations. However, SCC lagged estimates due to lower average selling prices despite improved coal sales in 4Q23. Banks, particularly BDO, BPI, and MBT, reported robust earnings, benefiting from the high-interest rate environment in the previous year. MBT surprised with a larger dividend payout, translating to an 8% dividend yield. Property companies also showed improvement, with ALI driven by better property development revenues while SMPH was lifted by its mall segment.

On the macroeconomic front, the BSP maintained its policy rates unchanged in its first Monetary Board meeting for 2024. The BSP slightly adjusted its inflation estimates, signaling the need to keep monetary policy tight to anchor inflation expectations amid various risks, including geopolitical tensions, higher rice and electricity prices due to El Nino, and increased gasoline prices. On that note, February's inflation print surpassed expectations, at 3.4% YoY versus 3.0% market consensus and January's print of 2.8%, driven by a significant increase in rice inflation, the fastest in 15 years.

The Philippine economy's stable growth, disinflation outlook, and potential 2024 policy easing offer an optimistic investment landscape. We project corporate earnings to grow by 6% in 2024, considering a 13x PE for FY2024, which puts our FY2024 PSEI target at 7,400.
